# The Present Perfect Form

#### Positive Form (Present Perfect Tense)





Affirmative	Auxiliary Verb	Past Participle
She/He/It	has ('s)	slept/worked
I/We/You/They	have ('ve)	slept/worked

Negative	Auxiliary Verb	Past Participle
She/He/It	has not (hasn't)	slept/worked
I/We/You/They	have not (haven't)	slept/worked





Questions	Auxiliary Verb	Subject	Past Participle
Where/What	have	I/we/you/they	done/worked/slept
Where/What	has	she/he/it	done/worked/slept

Short Answers	Auxiliary Verb	Past Participle
Yes	we/you/they/I> have	slept/worked
Yes	he/she/it> has	slept/worked
No	we/you/they/l have not (haven't)	slept/worked
No	he/she/it> has not (hasn't)	slept/worked

Regular verbs use -ed form as the past participle. Irregular verbs have irregular forms.

#### past participle

wait (regular) see (irregular) waited saw

waited seen



Note: You must practice and memorize the horrible list of irregular verbs.

When to use the present perfect tense?

• to describe an event in the past without a definite time.

Example: Someone has broken a window in our classroom.

to describe what someone has completed or achieved in a period of time.

Example: I've finished my homework, and I've cleaned my room.

• to describe how many things someone has done.

Example: Scientists have found more than 30 unknown Insects.

• to describe someone's experiences, what he or she has done in life.

Example: I've travelled by plane, but I haven't flown in a helicopter.

• to describe changes, comparing past and present.

Example: Our climate has become much warmer.
