Future forms

be going to and will



- We use **be going to** and **will** to make predictions.
- We use **be going to** to talk about something we expect to happen because of evidence we have now: Look at that blue sky. It's going to be hot today.
- We use **will** to talk about something that we think, believe, or know will happen in the future: I think computers will do everything for us in the future.
- We use **be going to** and **will** to talk about future actions.
- We use **be going to** if we are talking about things that we have already decided or planned to do: 'What are you going to do tonight?' 'I'm going to stay at home.'
- We use **will** to talk about decisions that we make at the moment of speaking:
'Tea or coffee?' 'I'll have tea, please.'
- The form of **be going to** is: **am/are/is + (not) going to + infinitive**
- The form of **will** is: **will/won't + infinitive without to.**
